August 11, 2026, 5:00 pm, at NEWLIFE Church. Sew In, in the Theater Room.

September 8, 2026, 7:00 pm, at NEWLIFE Church, Quilters by the Bay Quilt Guild Trunk Show. Members from QBB will join our meeting and bring quilts to show. In a reciprocal agreement, members from our guild will do a Trunk Show at their quilt guild meeting on Nov. 4, 9:30 am (Church of Ascension, 21641 Great Mills Rd, Lexington Park.



October 13, 2026, 7:00 pm, at NEWLIFE Church. Karen Kehl from Better Done Quilts will present Commemoration Quilts. Commemoration quilts range from signature quilts to modern art quilts. Karen will review some famous commemoration quilts, and share commemoration quilts made or received by the presenter. Different types of commemoration quilts including some with hidden messages will be shared and discussed. The presentation concludes with ideas on how to design and make your own commemoration quilt to honor and remember a special day.



Saturday, October 17, 2026, Karen Kehl Workshop: Strip Piecing Mini Land, Sea and Skyscapes, location TBD. Have you ever thought about making a stunning landscape or seascape quilt, but didn't know where to start? If so, this class is for you. Strip piecing nature scenes is a great stress reducer and a fantastic way to use up scraps! In half a day, you will have learned techniques to assemble your project and will started laying out your masterpiece. By the end of the day, you will have a small landscape or seascape (up to 15 x 18 inches) laid out and

partially or completely sewn. This fun technique uses 1.25 inch strips to "paint" a landscape or seascape. The class will discuss choosing pictures for inspiration, selecting fabrics, organizing fabrics, laying out the quilt, and piecing techniques. This is a fun activity that includes improvisational elements. The quilt you make will be a one-of-a kind work of art!

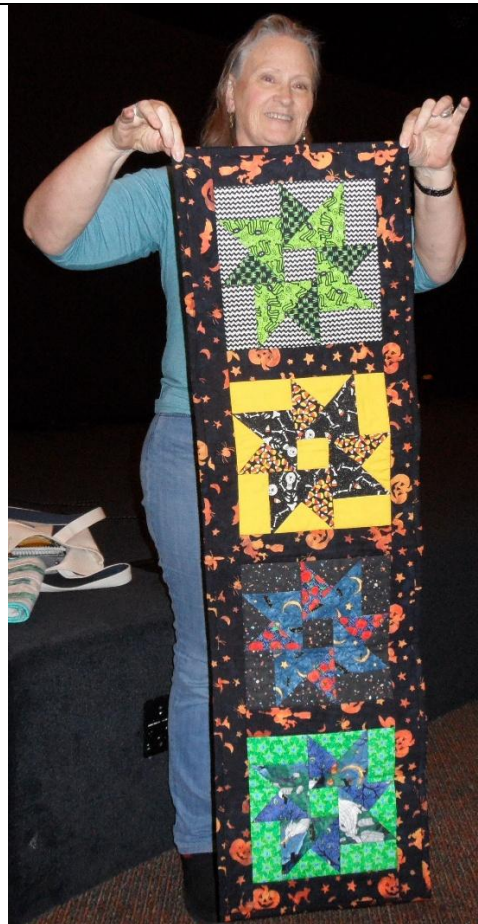
