The Greenbelt Federal Courthouse Quilt Show**

The Greenbelt Federal Courthouse has again sanctioned a quilt exhibit for 2026, the 22nd to be shown there. The show will go up on Wednesday, January 28, 2026, and will be hung for three months. Eight area quilt guilds have participated in the past, so there are **specific guidelines** for all entrants to follow, as listed below:

1. Entries (two per person) are submitted by email to:
 - a. Hilke Hoefler (NEW EMAIL!!)
hrhsew2day@gmail.com
 - b. Include the Name, Size (W x L) and digital PHOTO FOR EACH QUILT.
 - c. We also need your personal info:
address, cell phone, guild affiliations.



2. Submissions START on December 10, 2025, and are reviewed on a “first come, first served” basis. All skill levels are encouraged!
3. Entries are selected by SIZE (10” to maximum 120”), IMPACT and DESIGN.
 - a. All quilts over 21” must have a hanging sleeve.
4. We encourage entrants to help with the installation of the show. It requires 12-15 people and takes about five hours (10:00-3:00).
5. If I have given you a “verbal invitation” in the past, you must still follow all the above guidelines.
