STUDY IN COLOR PLACEMENT  
BLOCK OF THE MONTH  
June 2025  
BEACH BLOSSOM

Only one more after this month. You will be sewing the same basic pattern and keeping your block. Please bring them to the meeting to share during Show and Tell.

Fabric Requirements – Use fabrics left from January thru May BOM. (Fat Quarters [no large prints, not good for directional prints; you may use solids]. Every fabric will **not** be used in every block. A fabric may not be used how you anticipate. Label your fabrics - Fabric A [pink], Fabric B [green] etc.)

Main color – Fabric A  
Lighter shade of main color – Fabric B  
Complimentary color – Fabric C  
Lighter shade of complimentary color – Fabric D  
Light background – Fabric E  
Dark background – Fabric F

Classic Color Combinations

Pink/blue/white/green  
Blue/yellow/white/navy  
Red/white/gray/black  
Peach/teal/tan/brown

Cutting Instructions (will vary for each block)

C	1 – 7 ¼" square 2 – 4 ¼" squares 4 – 2 ½" squares	D	4 – 4 ¼" squares 4 – 2 ½" squares 4 – 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles
E	4 – 4 ¼" squares 4 – 2 ½" squares	F	1 – 7 ¼" square 2 – 4 ¼" squares 4 – 2 ½" squares

1. Make ½ square triangles 4 at a time. Place the following 4 ¼" fabrics right sides together (RST), sew ¼" on all 4 sides, cut on both diagonals. Trim to 2 ½" square. Figure 1

1 – C/D      1 – C/E      2 – D/E      1 – D/F      1 – E/F

Repeat with the 7 1/4" squares – C/F. Trim to 4 ½" square.

2. Lay out the pieces like page 2. Sew in rows RST. In rows 3 & 4, and 5 & 6 the end units need to be sewn in a four patch before adding to the center unit. Figure 2. Press the rows in opposite directions. Sew the rows together. Press open. Trim to 16 ½" square.
