Upcoming Programs and Workshops

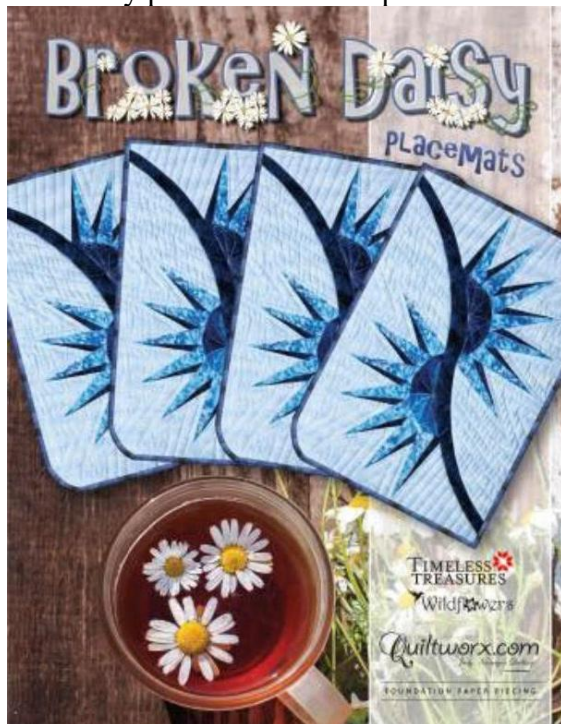

Elections

Voting shall be by ballot at the May general meeting. Each member attending will receive a ballot. Nominations from the floor will be also accepted at that time. Members will vote during the meeting and give their ballot to the Nominating Committee. Results will be determined based on a simple majority of members present. The president will announce the election results orally by the end of the meeting.

The month of June will be a time for the current officers to transition and share information with the new officers. The new officers will take office on July 1.

Listed below are the official duties for each position. **Please feel free to reach out to Julie or Marlene if you have any specific questions.**

The President shall:

- a. Be chief executive officer and spokesperson for the Guild.
- b. Represent the Guild and preside over all meetings – general, executive and special.
- c. Instruct the newsletter editor and secretary regarding the issuance of notices, minutes, and general correspondence.
- d. Ensure that the Bylaws are reviewed, and changes ratified by June 30 of odd numbered years.
- e. Be responsible for the Guild's email account. The president will delegate or handle (answer, forward to the appropriate chairperson, or delete) all emails as required.
- f. Be a signatory on the Guild's checking account and sign checks in the treasurer's absence.

The Secretary shall:

- a. Keep records of minutes, including all motions made and carried at each general, Board or special meeting.
- b. Furnish a copy of general meeting minutes for inclusion in the newsletter.
- c. Take care of general correspondence, as requested.
- d. Provide copies of board meeting minutes to all board members.
- e. As requested, provide notices to local papers as required about meetings and upcoming events.

OHIO STAR March 2026 BOM

Note: ALL centers are the same floral fabric. If you did not get a block at the meeting—or want more—contact me (withak2c1g@gmail.com) ASAP and I will mail you one.

Fabrics Choose colors to go with the flowers in D...your choice.

- A** Background
 - 4 @ 4.5" square
 - 1 @ 5.5" square
- B** Star Points
 - 2 @ 5.5" square
- C** Inside star contrast...white or white with small print or dots
 - 1 @ 5.5" square
- D** Center ...Floral provided
 - Trim to 4.5" square



Sew with scant 1/4" seams.

Make Half Square Triangle (HST) Units

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the two 5.5" Fabric B pieces.
 2. Pair one 5.5" B with one 5.5" A, right sides together.
 3. Pair one 5.5" B with one 5.5" C, right sides together.
 4. Sew 1/4" on each side of drawn line. Cut on drawn line. Press toward B.
- This gives you four HST units.

Make Quarter Square Triangle (QST) Units

1. Take one HST created with A/B and one HST created with B/C and place right sides together so that the two B pieces are NOT on top of each other.
2. The seams should be on top of each other and *nested*.
3. Draw a diagonal line perpendicular to the seam.
4. Sew 1/4" on each side of drawn line. Cut on line.
5. Repeat with remaining A/B and B/C.
6. Trim and square up to 4.5" squares. It helps to use a ruler with a diagonal line. Watch corners. Press.

Layout the Block

Sew the rows and assemble the Block

Press seams of row 1 and 3 away from center. Press row 2 towards center

Trim to 12.5" X 12.5"
