

Before our break **Anita Turley** discussed her plans for the monster blocks using a panel. **Anita Turley** moved, and **Collette Barksdale** seconded to approve the minutes.

2026 Budget was discussed at the September 2 Board meeting. Susan Blanton will send the proposed budget to all members.

**Programs - Elizabeth Sawyer** reported: in October, **Susan Zimmerman**, a fabric representative, will have a Q & A session. # Christmas Ornaments October 2025 Block of the Month

Four fabrics needed: Background white or white-on-white Hanger **H** gold or silver Ornament **Or**Stripe **S** 

Background fabric: **A** 2 @ 3 X 1½ **B** 1 X 1½ **C** 2 @ 4½ X 1½

**D** 6½ X 1½ **E** 4 @ 1½ X 1½

Hanger fabric: H 1½ X 1

Ornament fabric: **Or** 2 @ 4½ X 2 Stripe: **\$** 4½ X 1½



Scant 1/4 " seams

1. Join **Or** pieces to the **S** piece so that the stripe is in the middle.

2. Mark or press a diagonal line on each **E.** Place on the four corners of **Ors** snowball style. Stitch on line, trim and press to outside.

3. Stitch B to H. Add A to each side.

4. Stitch a C to each side of OrS.

5. Stitch Hanger piece to top.

6. Stitch **D** to bottom.

7. Square up to  $6\frac{1}{2}$  ".





Background: white Hanger: gold or silver Center: fussy cut Ornament: coordinates with center.

Center= 2 ½ " square

Background fabric: **A** 2 @ 3½ X 1½ **B** 1½ X 1 **C** 2 @ 4½ X 1½ **D** 6½ X 1½

**E** 4 @ 1½ X 1½

H 1½ X 1 (gold or silver)

Ornament: **G** 2 @ 2½ X 1½ **F** 2 @ 4½ X 1½

Scant  $\frac{1}{4}$  " seams. Follow same basic directions as above, attaching **G** and **F** to center square. Snowball the square. Add **C** to sides. Attach **H**anger piece to top and **D** to bottom. Square up to  $6\frac{1}{2}$  ".

Make one or both!! Quick blocks.
